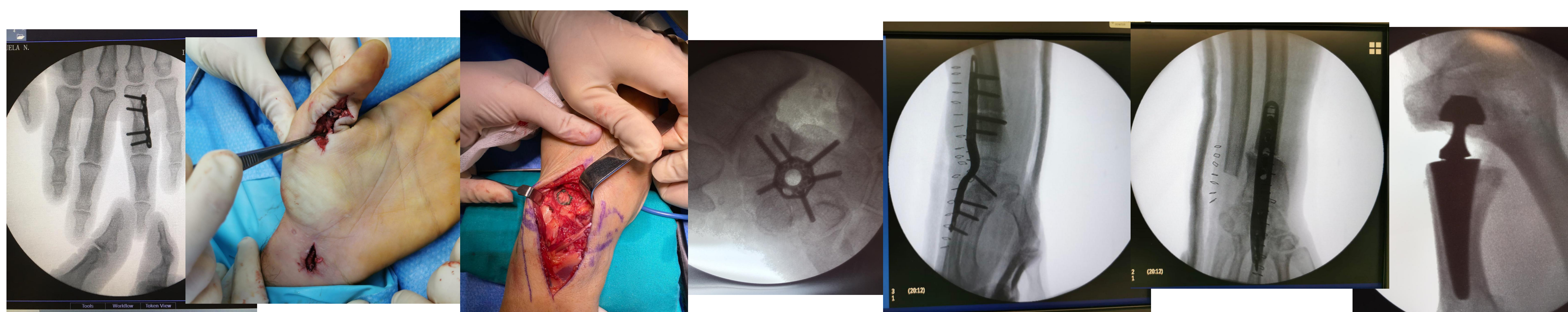

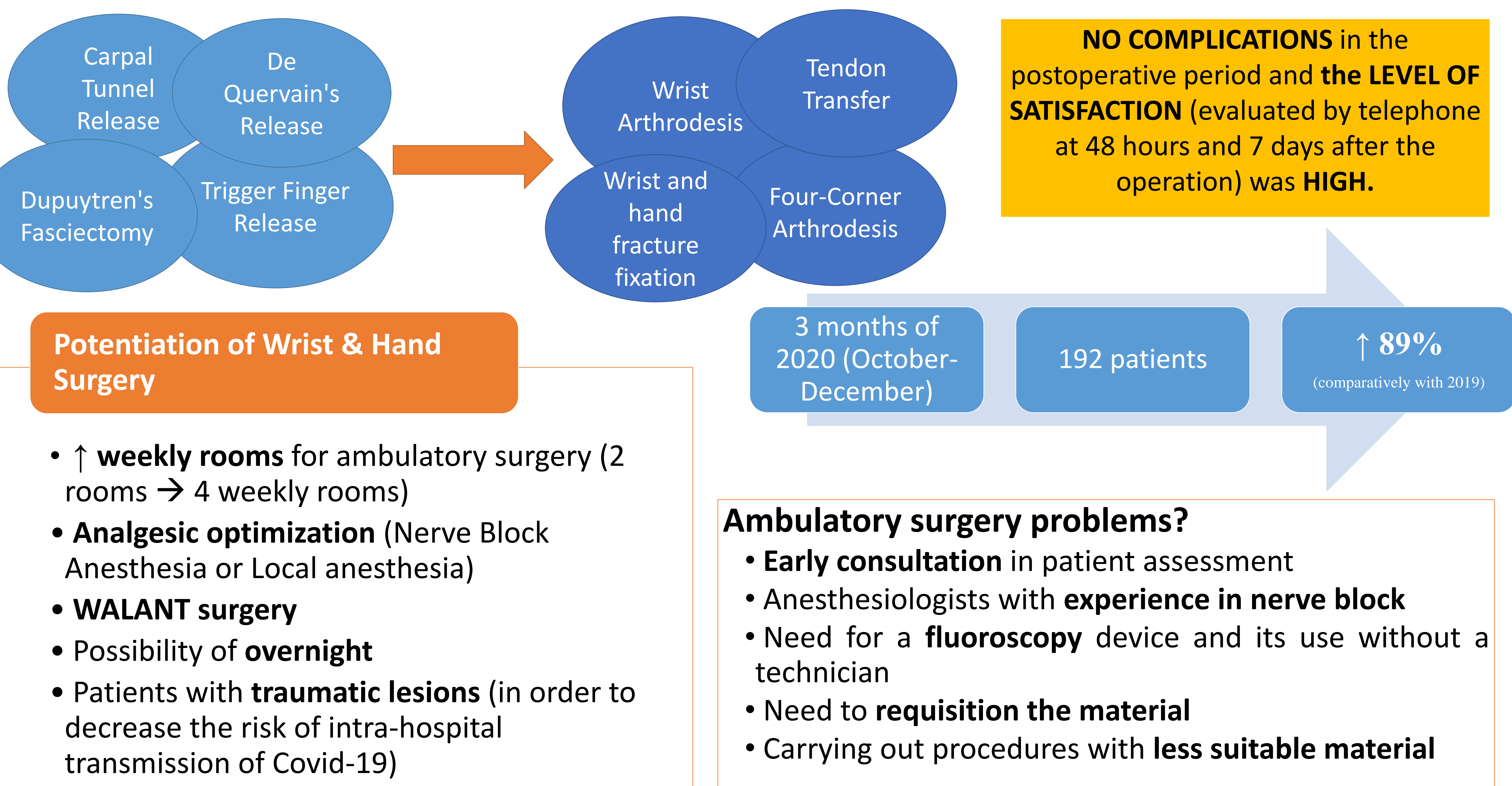
- Hand Surgery in Ambulatory Surgery Center during Covid-19 pandemic -
